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### **MAN SENTENCED IN 2005 RACKETEERING CASE**

A man indicted in 2005, accused of scamming individuals and businesses out of hundreds of thousands of dollars, has finally been sentenced today.

**Douglas Alan Glaser** (DOB: 11-04-70 ) was found guilty of violating the Colorado Organized Crime Control Act (F2), conspiracy, securities fraud, forgery, criminal impersonation, credit card fraud, and possession of a weapon by a previous offender in three separate trials earlier this year. Today he was sentenced in Denver District Court to 25 years in prison.

The case was prosecuted by Denver Chief Deputy DA Joe Morales and Deputy DA Phil Geigle. It spanned a remarkable 7 year time frame in which there were 8 scheduled trials, 2 mistrials, 7 different attorneys at different times for the defendant and numerous appeals. Glaser has served 1,419 days behind bars awaiting the final disposition of the case.

The criminal enterprise came to light in 2005 after Glaser was the victim of a hit-and-run accident. A Denver police officer became suspicious of Glaser's identification, prompting further investigation. A Denver Grand jury later indicted Glaser and a co-defendant alleging that they worked together on a securities fraud scheme that misrepresented stock investments and failed to disclose Glaser's criminal history. The indictment further alleged that Glaser created a false identity that he used to commit numerous additional crimes.

The indictment was the result of a cooperative effort by the Denver Police Department, the Colorado Division of Securities, the Office of the Inspector General - Social Security Administration and the United States Secret Service.
