**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR AN ARREST
WARRANT FOR THE PERSON OF:**

Cameron Tyler Spain, DOB: 4/18/1990, a white male, who is depicted below in a January 28, 2022 booking photo. He stands approximately 5'08" tall and weighs 150 pounds, with blue eyes and brown hair.



For the crime of CRS 18-3-102(1)(a), First Degree Murder, a class 1 felony.

I, Detective Daniel Andrews 96015 of the Denver Police Homicide Unit, the Affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a first-degree murder was committed, and that the homicide was committed by Cameron Spain, are the following:

Saturday, January 15, 2022

At 5:44 p.m. Denver 911 received a call from RTD dispatch reporting that two of their [REDACTED], [REDACTED], and [REDACTED], just came upon a man down alongside the roadway at 29th & Arkins, apparently suffering from an unknown medical problem. [REDACTED], who lives in an apartment building one block east of 29th & Arkins also called 911 to report hearing 5 gunshots in that area and seeing two parties ride bikes out of the area, one while wearing a headlamp.

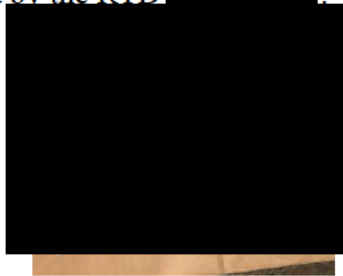
Denver Police, Fire and Paramedics were dispatched, emergently. Among them were [REDACTED] and his recruit, [REDACTED]. Upon their arrival Denver Fire and Paramedics were attending to a then unidentified black male victim who was suffering from several gunshot wounds. He was rushed to Denver Health Medical Center by ambulance but unfortunately, he succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced deceased by Dr. [REDACTED] at 6:08 p.m.

District 6 Officers secured the scene and requested the assistance of investigators. Your Affiant was contacted by his supervisor, Sergeant Scott Hagan, and assigned as the lead investigator at 6:16 p.m.

Your Affiant responded to Denver Police Department Headquarters, while his partner, Detective Bruce Gibbs was assigned as the secondary investigator and responded to the scene.

Your Affiant learned that the victim's clothing had been cut off on scene, and that 5 fired cartridge casings, from several different manufacturers, had been found in the area where the victim was discovered. A large knife, which is pictured below in a crime scene documentation photo, was near his left side when he was first discovered by the RTD [REDACTED]



The area around 29th & Arkins Ct. is one where many unhoused people have set up their camps. The Salvation Army's large Crossroads Shelter is at 1901 29th St., which is right around the corner from this homicide scene. Several vehicles, including one RV, which people live in, were also parked in the immediate area. Officers' efforts to locate witnesses to the shooting were fruitless, apart from a tent resident of the area who reported non-descript arguing between two men prior to hearing shots fired.

Your Affiant went to the shelter and left his contact information with the management, requesting to be notified if anyone of their residents came forward with information related to the victim, or his murder.

Your Affiant also went to [REDACTED] apartment and stood on his balcony, which faces northwest, or towards this homicide scene, so that [REDACTED] could point out where the events he observed occurred. He stated that after hearing the gunshots he went out onto his balcony and although he couldn't see the victim at that time, he did observe two parties, who he believed to be men, one of which was wearing a headlamp, or had a light on their bicycle. He said he observed these parties moving around in the area where he eventually saw emergency responders attend to the victim. After a short time, both of these parties rode their bikes eastbound on 29th St. He described them as "booking it," or as if they were fleeing, in Your Affiant's words.

The victim was eventually identified as Tony Bozman, DOB: 01/03/1984. Your Affiant later learned that he'd been staying at Crossroads in the days prior to his murder.

Sunday, January 16, 2022

Your Affiant contacted [REDACTED], by phone, after finding her listed in law enforcement databases as the [REDACTED]. Unfortunately, [REDACTED] was in Colorado Springs at the time, so Your Affiant was unable to meet with her in person but rather had to advise her over the phone that [REDACTED] had been murdered. She was understandably distraught, and shocked.

[REDACTED] told Your Affiant that she and the victim have two children together, but are estranged, in part because of his substance abuse struggles. She said that she believed he had a cellular phone, but she didn't have the number, and hadn't talked to him in about 2 weeks.

At about noon Your Affiant learned that Officer John Logue had been dispatched to the Crossroad Shelter to pick up property belonging to the victim and had spoken briefly with the victim's "██████████" ██████████.

Your Affiant phoned ██████████, who was willing to speak on the phone but declined to come to DPD HQ to make a formal statement at that time. In brief summary ██████████ stated that he met the victim about a week ago at the Crossroads shelter and said they'd struck up a friendship. The victim was asked to leave the shelter after he didn't come in by the 8:00 p.m. curfew on Friday night, January 14, 2022. The victim came to the shelter to pick up his belongings on Saturday, January 15, 2022 in the early afternoon, and was in the company of a man who ██████████ didn't know.

██████████ said that the victim seemed agitated, or nervous, and repeatedly said, "I fucked up!" ██████████ assumed, given that he knows the victim is a drug user, that perhaps the victim was in trouble over drugs, but the victim refused to elaborate when asked. ██████████ asked the victim if he was going to be ok and the victim made a statement to the effect of, "Yeah, it's nothing I can't handle."

Sometime around 4:00 p.m. the victim walked away from the shelter, leaving his cell phone in ██████████ care so he could charge it. That phone was among the property ██████████ had turned over to Officer Logue earlier in the day.

Your Affiant retrieved the phone from Officer Logue and discovered that it was passcode protected. Your Affiant tried several codes that ██████████ provided, but none of them unlocked the phone. Consequently, Technical Electronic Support Unit Detective Jeremy Cain, who has specialized training in forensic cellphone downloads, was called into work to assist Your Affiant.

Given the sophistication of the victim's phone's operating system Detective Cain was only able to obtain a partial download of the data, which Your Affiant has found to be useless in advancing the investigation. Your Affiant has obtained a search warrant for the victim's call detail records, the results of which are pending.

Monday, January 17, 2022

Your Affiant created, and had published, a Crime Stoppers bulletin requesting the public's assistance with this investigation.

At about 2:45 p.m. Your Affiant returned to the Crossroads Shelter and spoke with staff, including ██████████. ██████████ stated that residents of the shelter, none of which wanted to speak with law enforcement due to fear of retaliation, told him that the victim was possibly shot following a dispute with people who live in or are associated with the RV that had been parked on the corner of 29th & Arkins at the time of the homicide. Your Affiant looked outside and saw that the RV was no longer parked where it had been at the time of the homicide. ██████████ went on to say that the RV is owned or controlled by a white male who goes by the street name "Bama."

Staff was also able to show Your Affiant a clip of their surveillance video which captures the homicide. Unfortunately, given that it was dark at the time of the homicide, and the distance from the scene to the shelter's camera, no identifying observations can be made of the involved parties. However, it does

demonstrate the victim was interacting with at least two other parties in the moments before muzzle flashes can be seen emanating from a firearm, which immediately causes the victim to collapse to the ground. Also, probatively, the video makes it clear that the shooter was wearing a headlamp, which allowed Your Affiant to track their movements both before and after the shooting, even though the identity of the shooter can't be observed.

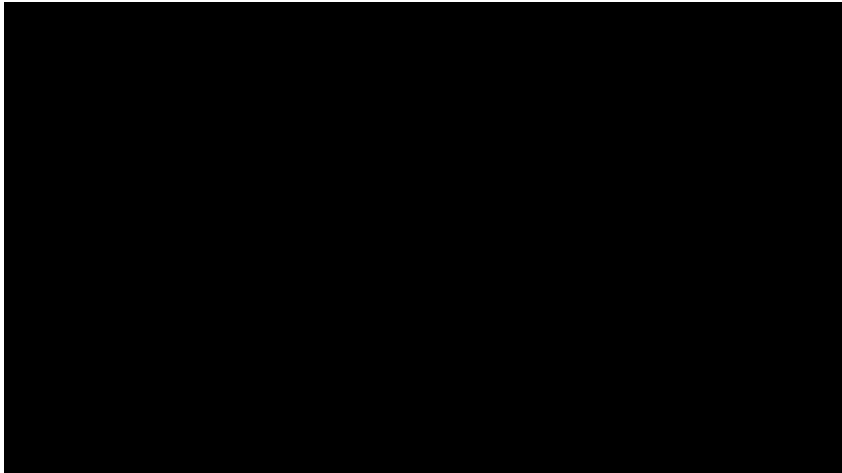
After the shooting the suspect and other party move to the area of the RV. The parties appear to gather items from the ground near the side door of the RV and then two get on bikes and ride out of the area, consistent with what [REDACTED] reported when he called 911. The third party jogs out of the area.

The shelter's video shows the RV remained in the area until Sunday afternoon, January 16, 2022, when it was driven out of their cameras' view.

Tuesday, January 18, 2022

Your Affiant attended the victim's postmortem examination at the Denver Office of the Medical Examiner at 9:30 a.m. Forensic Pathology Fellow [REDACTED] M.D., conducted the examination. Your Affiant observed that the victim suffered 5 gunshot wounds, indicating that he'd been struck by all 5 of the shots the suspect fired at him. She has ruled his death a homicide, the result of gunshot wounds to the torso. One of the bullets struck his spine which may have caused the dramatic collapse of the victim that Your Affiant saw on the surveillance video. 2 of the 5 gunshots struck the victim in the center of his back.

Your Affiant created and distributed a Special Bulletin requesting Officer's assistance with locating and identifying the parties associated with the RV, which is pictured below in a crime scene photo from the night of the homicide.



District 6 Homeless Outreach Team Officer [REDACTED] contacted Your Affiant and advised him that the RV is owned/operated by "Bama," who she knows to be Cameron Spain, DOB: 04/18/1990. She sent Your Affiant a screenshot of his Facebook profile picture, which is below, from his [www.facebook.com/\[REDACTED\]](http://www.facebook.com/[REDACTED]) page. In his profile picture Mr. Spain is wearing an Alabama facemask. Officer Harris stated that she's had frequent interaction with Mr. Spain, including as recently as Tuesday, January 11, 2022, when she and her partner, Officer Nick Grove, posted his RV with a tow warning notice.

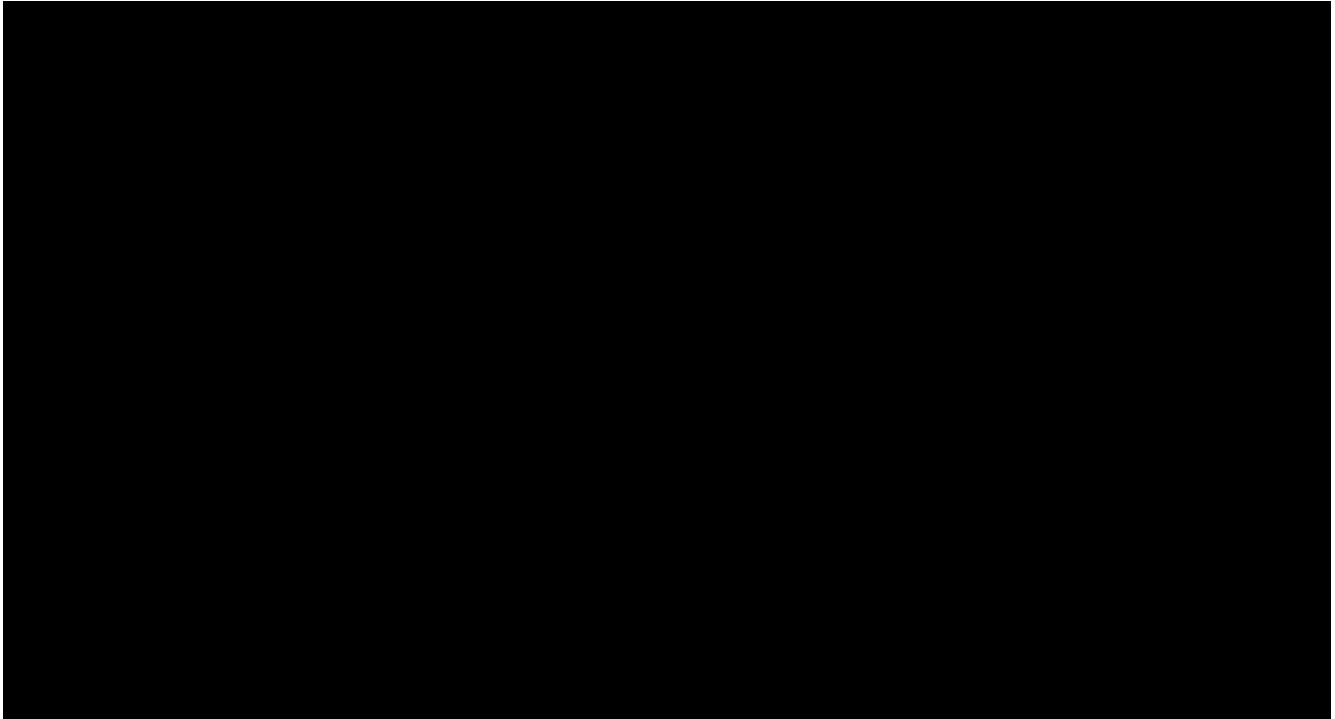
Your Affiant researched Mr. Spain and learned that records list his place of birth is Alabama, which is apparently the origin of his “Bama” moniker. Mr. Spain has a lengthy criminal history, including an arrest for unlawful possession of a handgun and narcotics about two months before this homicide, and a mile away.

Your Affiant also received an anonymous Crime Stoppers tip which stated that someone shot and killed the victim after he’d entered Bama’s RV in an attempt to steal drugs.

Wednesday, January 19, 2022

Your Affiant learned that Mr. Spain is on GPS monitoring as part of a pending case and requested data for the time around this event. Pretrial Supervisor [REDACTED] advised Your Affiant that Mr. Spain was in the area where his RV was parked until 5:37 p.m. when he left the area east bound on 29th St., traveling at 7 MPH, indicating he was probably either in a vehicle or on a bicycle. The below screenshot of Mr. Spain’s GPS data covers the period between 5:20 and 5:37 p.m. on the evening of this homicide. From having visited the scene himself and observing the RV that has now been determined to belong to Mr. Spain, Your Affiant knows that it was parked in the area where the green dots are clustered. The last data point depicted on this map is the red dot barely visible at the bottom of the text box and was recorded at 5:37.26 p.m.

The green dots are consistent with the location of the events immediately prior to the shooting which Your Affiant has observed on the shelter's video, as is the flight path. This is also the route the ██████ told Your Affiant he saw the two parties traveling, "booking it" on their bicycles after the shooting.

██████████, who works at the shelter and was personally acquainted with the victim, called Your Affiant to provide additional information he'd learned at 1:30 p.m. He started by telling Your Affiant that none of the people who were providing him information were willing to speak with investigators due to fear of retaliation. ██████████ stated that he'd been told that the victim may have stolen a cell phone, possibly the phone currently in Your Affiant's possession in fact, from Bama's RV, and that there'd been a physical confrontation between the two men one day prior to this homicide. Mr. Spain is listed as being 5'05" & 160 pounds, while the victim is about 6' & 240 pounds, so Your Affiant assumes he'd come out on top in a fight between the two. ██████████ also said he'd been told that "Bama is the shooter."

(Note: This is the third homicide of this exact nature {a homeless man shoots and kills another homeless party, or three of them in one case, with nearly all of the witnesses or associated parties also being homeless} that Your Affiant has been the primary investigator on during his 6 years in the Homicide Unit. In the prior two cases Your Affiant repeatedly heard from those that he attempted to obtain information from that they were in fear for their safety since they're forced to live among the accused and their associates, and don't have the ability to find safety behind the locked doors of their home, as Your Affiant does. That same concern has been repeatedly expressed during this investigation.)

Thursday, January 20, 2022

Your Affiant has known [REDACTED], AKA “[REDACTED]” since Your Affiant was the lead investigator into the 2018 shooting murder of three homeless parties by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] was associated with the victims and was relatively cooperative in that investigation.

[REDACTED] was contacted on the 29th & Arkins scene by responding Officers. He was apparently cooperative and provided a brief statement indicating that he’d been asleep in his tent until he was roused by the Officers searching for witnesses. Your Affiant doubts that [REDACTED] would have shot and killed the victim, in the presence of at least two eyewitnesses, and then simply walked a short distance down the street to wait in his tent to be contacted by Officers.

Your Affiant sent [REDACTED] a Facebook message requesting an interview and placed an attempt to locate on CCIC so that Your Affiant will be notified any time [REDACTED] is contacted by law enforcement. Your Affiant has also reviewed [REDACTED] criminal history, which is extensive, and not found a single contact or arrest for carrying or using a firearm. He has been arrested several times for carrying a concealed knife, but that is very common among the unhoused as many of them have expressed a concern to Your Affiant in past contacts about the need to protect themselves on the streets.

On April 27, 2021, Mr. Spain was ordered by The Honorable Judge Ericka Houck Englert, regarding 21CR2228, a felony menacing and felony violation of bail bond conditions (x3) case, not to possess or control a firearm or ammunition.

Your Affiant requested additional GPS data, including the raw data for mapping from pretrial services but was informed that a court order was required before they would provide any additional information on Mr. Spain’s GPS.

Friday, January 21, 2022

At 8:46 a.m. the Honorable Presiding Judge Nicole Rodarte signed Your Affiant’s affidavit and search warrant for Mr. Spain’s RV, which Your Affiant and Detective Gibbs executed shortly thereafter.

During the search a .357 revolver was located, but Your Affiant knows that it is not the murder weapon as the victim was shot to death by 9 mm projectiles which can't be fired from a .357 revolver.

However, one 9mm bullet was found in the RV, on the floor near the sleeping bunks. This bullet was marked "N CCI R 9mm Luger," and was silver in color. This is the same manufacturer and color of one of the 5 fired cartridge casings recovered at the scene.

Your Affiant delivered the victim's phone to the Denver field office of the United States Secret Service electronic evidence forensic laboratory at approximately 1:00 p.m. and requested their technicians, who have access to systems the DPD does not, attempt to forensically download the data from the phone. Those efforts are on-going.

Tuesday, January 25, 2022

The Honorable Judge Beth Faragher signed a court order for 6 days' worth of Mr. Spain's GPS data to be provided by pretrial services.

DPD Crime Lab Forensic Imaging Unit Specialist Ben Bender obtained numerous video clips from the Crossroads shelter for Your Affiant to review to further the investigation.

Your Affiant was notified that District 6 Investigations Detective Brian Norwell had just obtained an arrest warrant for Mr. Spain, for the charge of 2nd degree assault. Detective Norwell had been investigating a September 22, 2021 incident from the 1900 block of Grant St., during which a resident of one of the nearby apartment buildings had his cell phone snatched right out of his hand by someone, who remains unidentified, who was apparently associated with a homeless camp set up on the block. As this victim attempted to recover his phone, he was punched in the face by a second male, who was eventually identified as Ms. Spain, thanks to bystander's photographs. The victim suffered serious bodily injury in the form of a broken nose.

Thursday, January 27, 2022

Pretrial services returned the GPS data for Mr. Spain which was previously requested by court order. Your Affiant sent it to Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms & Explosives (ATF) Special Agent Mark Sonnendecker, who's an expert in electronic evidence. SA Sonnendecker mapped the data so that Your Affiant could work to track Mr. Spain and locate video surveillance evidence.

Friday, January 28, 2022

Mr. Spain had been released from custody on the trespassing warrant Your Affiant had him arrested on, and had been refitted with a GPS monitor, so Detective Lopez was able to locate him in a homeless camp at 17th and York. He was arrested without incident and jailed at the Downtown Detection Center, where he remains at this time.

Saturday, January 29, 2022

Your Affiant spent most of the day searching for, and retrieving, video evidence, all of which is summarized in a visual format in attachment A, at the end of this affidavit.

Friday, February 4, 2022

Your Affiant received both the victim's call detail records, and Mr. Spain's Facebook data. During subsequent reviews of those records and data, no connection was found between the two men, nor any obviously relevant communication or information

Conclusion:

Mr. Spain was present at this homicide scene, but claims to be an eye witness, rather than the shooter. Some of the best evidence uncovered in this homicide investigation has been Mr. Spain's own ankle monitor data. That data demonstrates that at the moment the 5 shots are fired into the victim, Mr. Tony Bozman, Mr. Spain was out of his RV, and had been for at least two minutes, not "as I'm walking out," (of the RV) in his words.

The video surveillance footage recovered from Crossroads shows, conclusively, that the shooter was the party wearing the headlamp. Only one party of the group of at least 4 has any sort of visible illumination during the events leading up to the shooting, during the shooting itself, as the RV is apparently secured, and then flees the area on a bicycle, and that is the shooter.

Your Affiant questions why [REDACTED], or anyone else for that matter, would secure Mr. Spain's RV door, after shooting the victim but before fleeing the area. It's logical that only someone with an interest in the items in the RV, and the RV itself, such as Mr. Spain or his [REDACTED], would have any reason to do so. Further, in reviewing the video, Your Affiant does not see anyone flee, after the shots are fired, to the south, which was the location of [REDACTED] tent, and the location of his eventual contact by responding Officers.

Mr. Spain told Your Affiant that he rode away from the scene on a BMX style bicycle. As pictured in attachment A, video captures the shooter, still wearing his headlamp, fleeing on a BMX style bicycle, which is clearly distinct from the other party who flees on a different type of bike. Mr. Spain's GPS data puts him in nearly the exact position, at the time the party is captured on video fleeing on the BMX style bike. While the video is not of sufficient quality to make any identifying observations about the party on the BMX bike, Mr. Spain's GPS putting him there at that moment leads to the logical conclusion that he is that party.

Your Affiant went to great lengths to test the validity and accuracy of Mr. Spain's GPS data by searching for video cameras in the locations where the data put Mr. Spain, with the following results, and as also depicted visually below in attachment A:

1. 5:37 p.m.-Data locating Mr. Spain in the 1900 block of 29th St., and a figure captured on video riding a BMX bike is there at that minute
2. 5:47 p.m.-Data locating Mr. Spain at 26th St. & Welton St., and video captures a figure riding a bike, with a light, through the intersection at that moment
3. 5:52 p.m.-Data locating Mr. Spain in the Subway at 757 E. 20th Ave., and the restaurant's video shows two parties, possibly Mr. Spain and [REDACTED], in the restaurant at that minute

4. 6:05 p.m.- Data locating Mr. Spain in the alley behind 2329 Emerson, and a homeowner's surveillance system not only captures two parties, almost certainly Mr. Spain and [REDACTED] walking through the alley as the male pushes a BMX bike, and but also captures him addressing the female as "[REDACTED]." A small black dog, dragging a leash, and wearing a coat, is following them
 - a. During his interview Mr. Spain told Your Affiant that immediately after the shooting he went to the area of 20th & Clarkson to pick up [REDACTED], and then they walked back to the area of the homicide together, his half of which is verified by his GPS data
5. 6:36 p.m.- Data locating Mr. Spain in front of RiNo liquors, 3083 Brighton Blvd., with video depicting the same male that was in the alley behind 2329 Emerson 30 minutes prior, and the same small dog
6. 6:37 p.m.- Data showing Mr. Spain walked away from the liquor store towards the river, with video footage showing the same

Therefore, at this time, there are at least 6 different locations where Mr. Spain's GPS data puts him, and video footage has been recovered of a party who fits Mr. Spain's physical description in those locations at the same time. Admittedly, in none of the footage is Your Affiant able to positively identify Mr. Spain. At times this is because of the camera quality or positioning, and at other times because Mr. Spain is covered under a baseball hat and face mask, just like he presents himself in his Facebook profile picture.

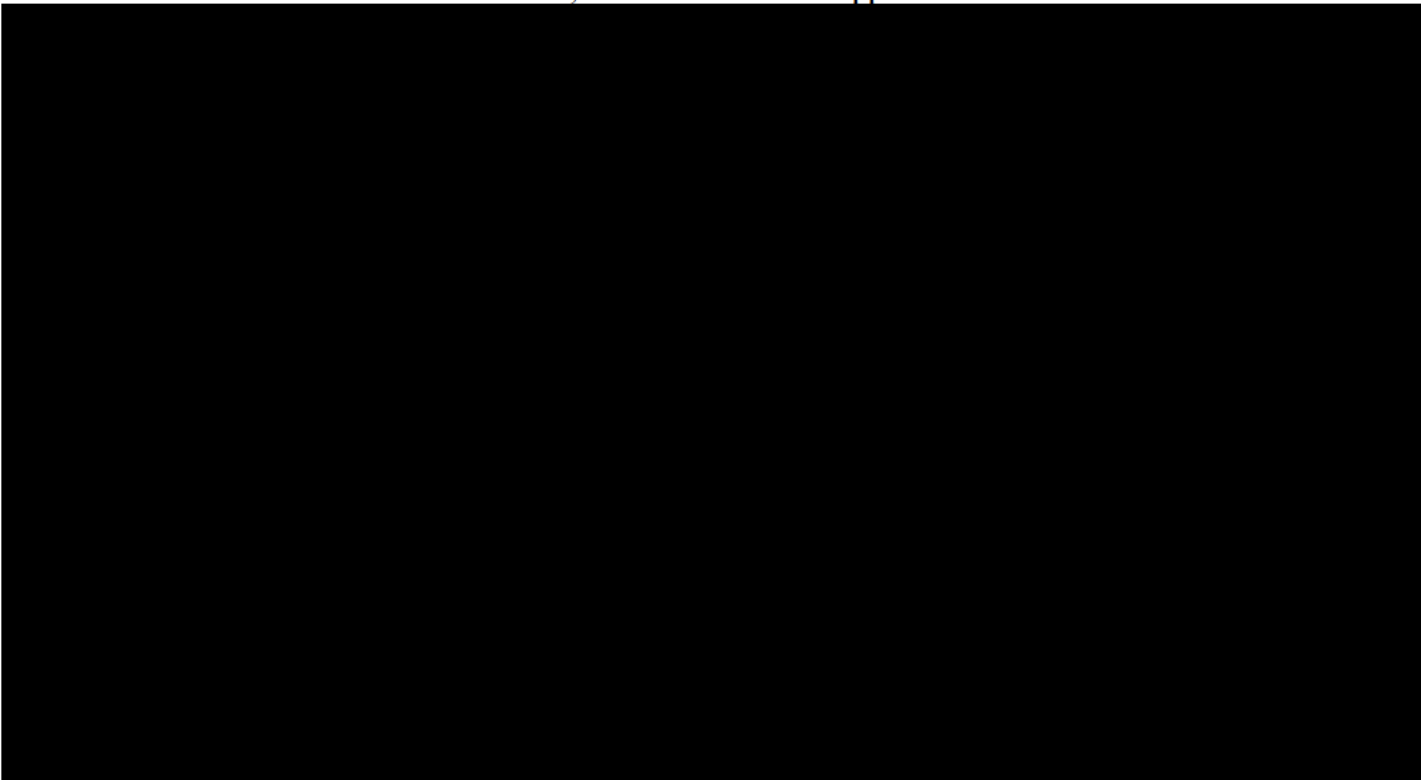
In summary, the video evidence clearly demonstrates that the person who fires the 5 gunshots into Tony Bozman's torso, killing him, was wearing a headlamp. That party can be followed on video, still wearing the headlamp, until they pass in front of the Crossroads shelter, and are captured on video. At that moment, Mr. Spain's GPS data puts him in that location, serving as a forensic identification of the party captured on video thanks to their own GPS monitor. Therefore, Your Affiant believes probable cause exists for the arrest of Cameron Spain for shooting and killing Tony Bozman.

ATTACHMENT A

Crossroads Shelter Camera CB61E (2)- Facing southwest, towards the scene, from the northwest edge of the building. Camera time is 60 minutes and 4 seconds slow, or behind actual time. Times stated below are actual time, not camera time.

The recording starts at approximately 5:15 p.m., when it's not yet dark. Your Affiant can see that the door to the RV is open, but the door opening is covered by a blanket, as seen on Officer Nick Grove's body worn camera from the January 11, 2022 clean up contact. This screenshot shows Mr. Spain moving the blanket to the side to exit the RV to exit and speak with the Officers, and also demonstrates his style of the baseball hat and facemask, which obscures his appearance.



On the evening of the homicide, beginning at about 5:30 p.m. there is activity around the passenger side of the RV and light can be seen emanating from the inside as someone moves the blanket to exit and re-enter.

At 5:32.36 p.m. the suspect wearing the headlamp exits the RV:



Within a minute, two parties join him. One coming from the area of the shelter on foot, and the other possibly coming out of the RV. By 5:35 p.m. a fourth party is in the immediate area of the passenger side and front of the RV. At least 3 of the 4, one of whom is the victim, and another the suspect, interact with each other on Arkins Ct, starting in the northeast bound lane but also moving out into the center of the road, causing traffic traveling in both directions to slow and move around them.

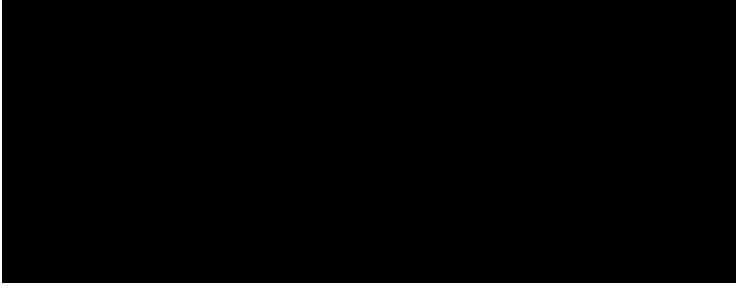
GPS evidence that Mr. Spain was out of the RV prior to the shots being fired at 5:36 p.m., contradicting his statement that he was in the RV until, or just moments before the shots were fired. Your Affiant added the white rectangle to this image as a general demonstration of where the RV was parked at the time.



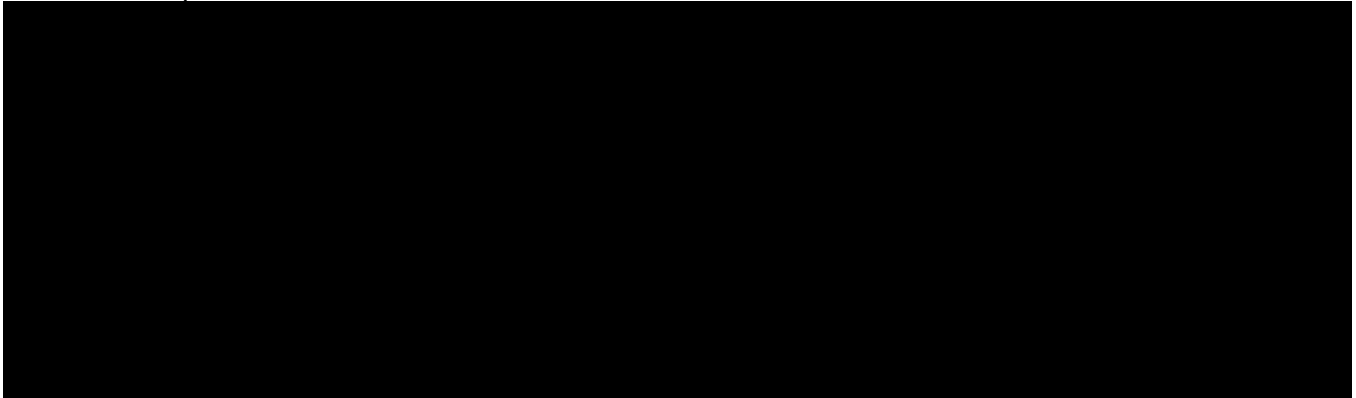
5:36.19 p.m.

The victim has backed towards the northwest edge of Arkins Ct., while the suspect in the headlamp moved towards him. The victim is illuminated by the headlamp as numerous muzzle flashes can be seen coming from the immediate area of the suspect in the headlamp. As the victim falls, the suspect in the headlamp must follow the victim to the ground, with his head, because the light moves to the ground, as pictured below:

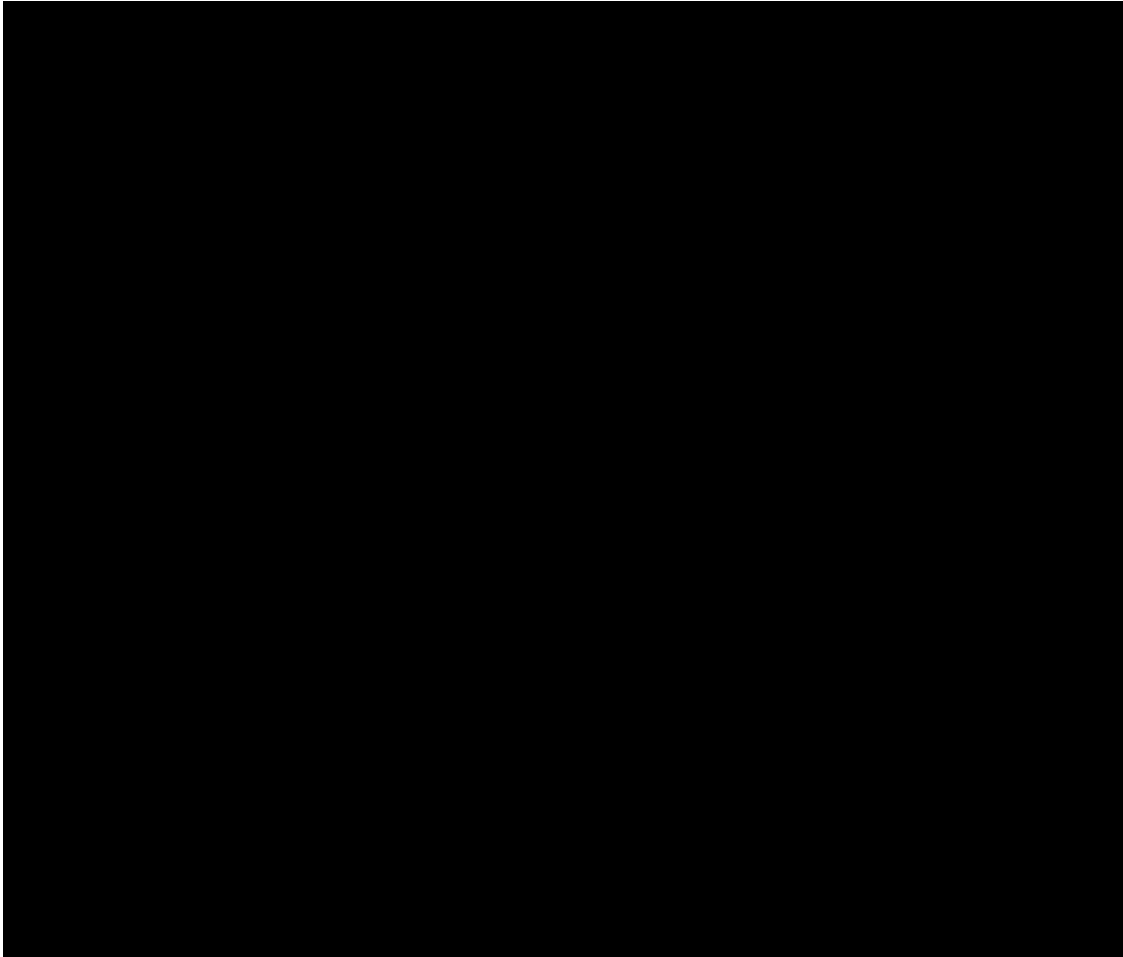


From the “processed” or zoomed in video at the same moment:

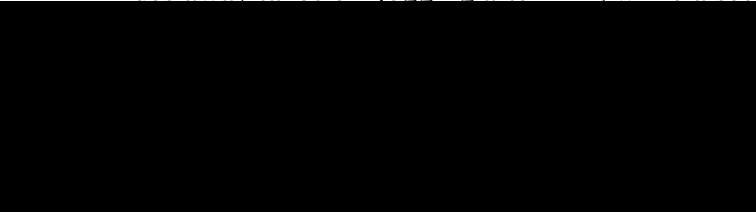


Immediately after firing the shots the suspect in the headlamp runs back to the RV, closes the door, and appears to manipulate something in the area of the door, presumably the hasp and padlock, as pictured in the second image which was taken on the day of the search warrant on the RV.

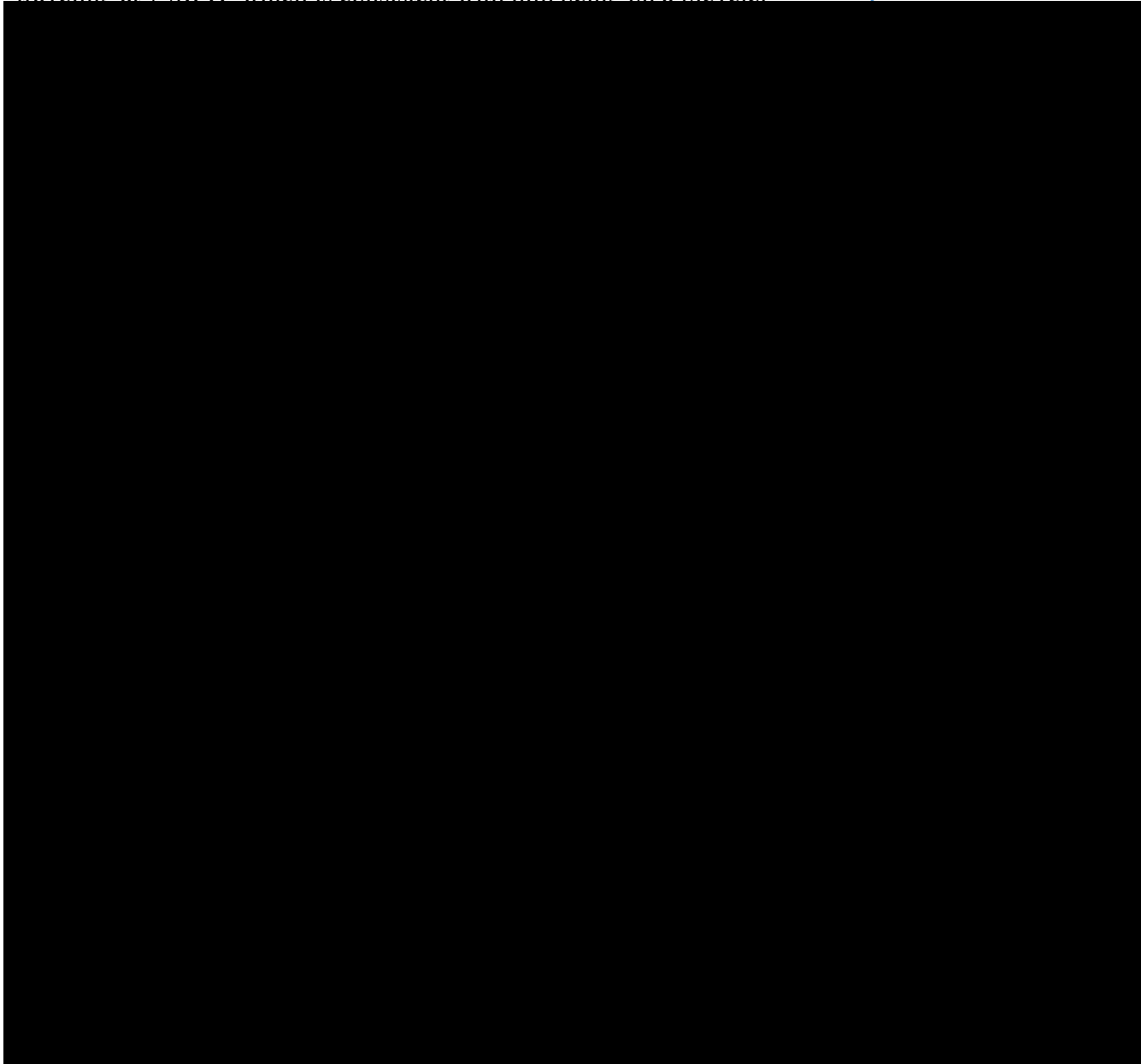
The suspect in the headlamp spends about 30 seconds doing something with items on the ground outside of the RV door and then gets on a bike at 5:37.02 p.m. and starts riding away southeast bound on 29th St., towards the front of the shelter. One unknown party who's near the door of the RV as the suspect rides away takes off jogging after him, while a second unknown party gets on a bike and rides southeast



Crossroads Shelter Camera CB61E (3)- Facing southwest, towards the scene, from the southeast edge of the building. **Camera time is 60 minutes and 4 seconds slow, or behind actual time.**

5:37.26 p.m.-Video of the suspect in the headlamp riding southeast in the top frame, as compared to Mr. Spain's GPS data screenshot showing him to be in relatively the same location, at that same moment, traveling at 7 MPH which is consistent with him being on a bicycle: /

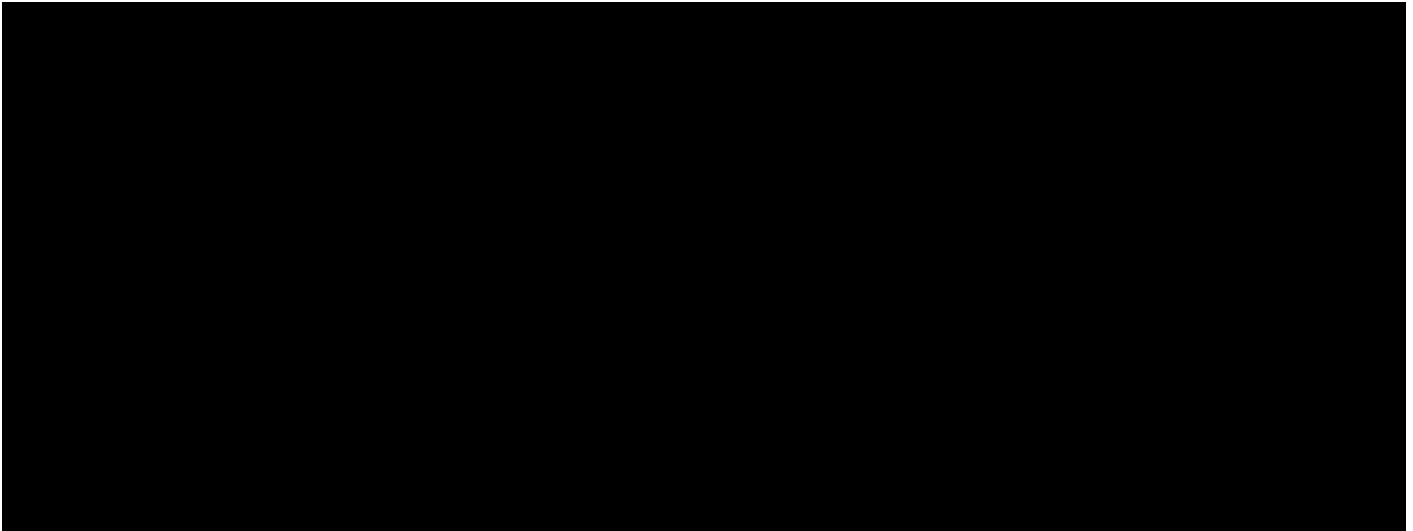


At 5:37.34 p.m. the suspect wearing the headlamp rides southeast across Delgany St. on a BMX style bicycle. This party is in view at the furthest top right of the frame from the time they ride away from the area of the RV, as pictured above, until this screenshot.

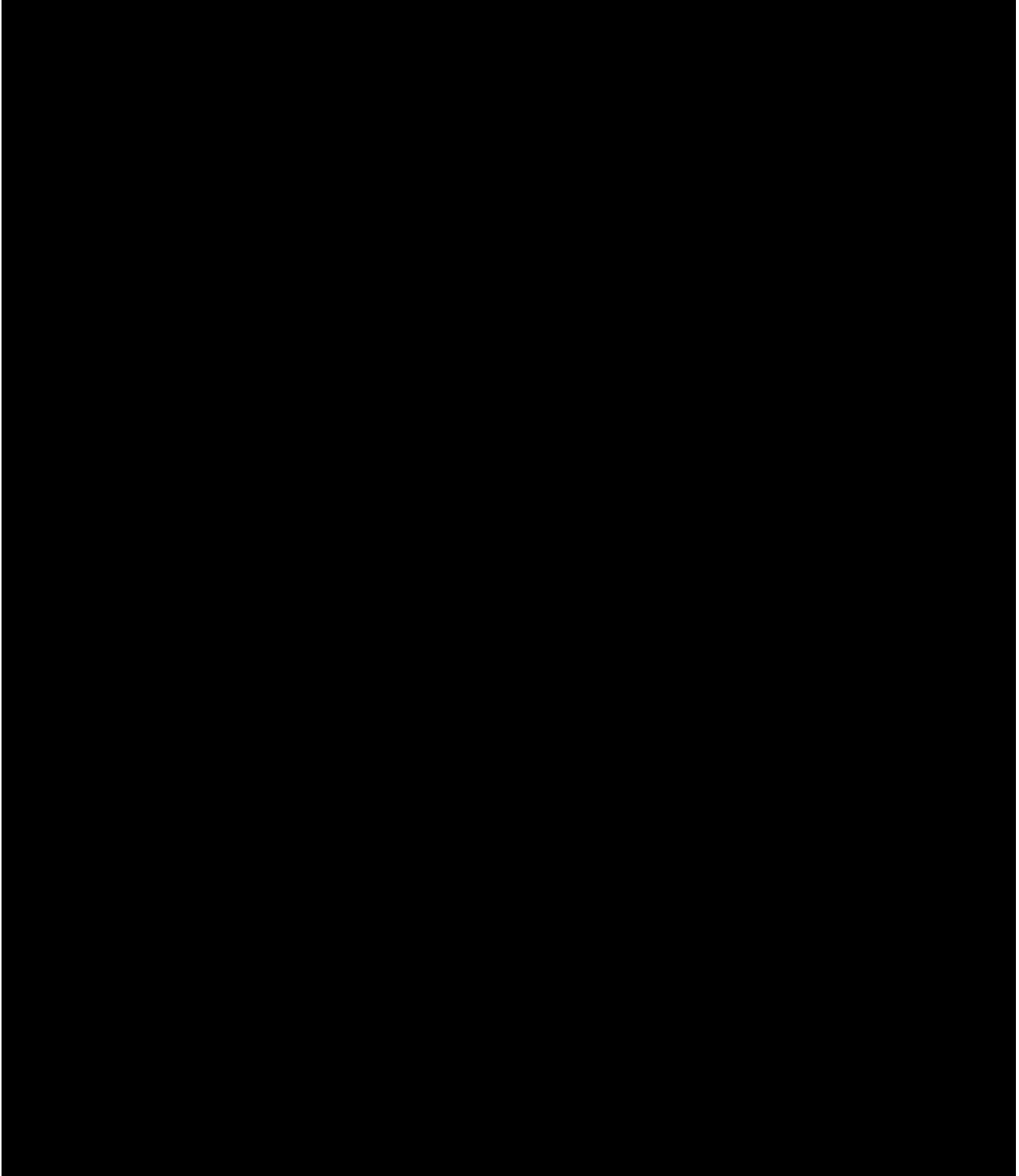


About 20 seconds later the runner and party on the other bike leave the camera's view after crossing Delgany. The runner appears to head northeast while the party on the bike follows the path of the suspect



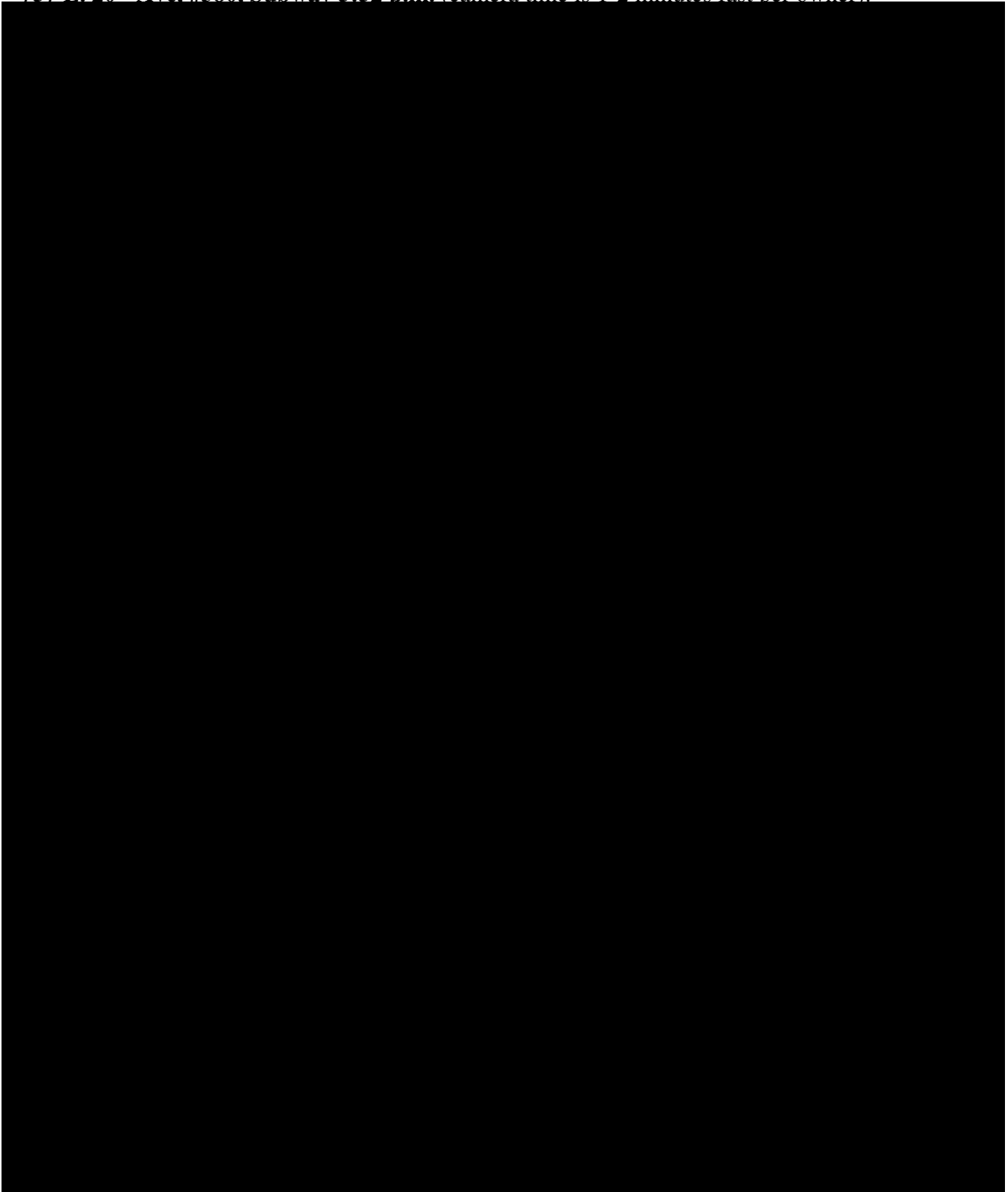
