



**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT
AND THE ARREST WARRANT FOR THE PERSON(S) OF:**

**Jaime Alexander Chavez Calix 10/12/1993, White Male, 5'6", 150lbs,
Black Hair, Brown Eyes, SID 4390961, FBI# 937380AE2 for 18-18-405(1),
(2)(c)(V),(2)(a)(III) Distribution of Fentanyl Resulting in Death a Class 1
Drug Felony**



I, Detective Paul Campbell, 06125, the affiant, state under oath that the facts known to the affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above named person(s), are the following:

The following information was personally observed by your affiant or learned through reading reports and speaking to other members of the Denver Police Department and other Colorado or Federal Law Enforcement Agencies as well as through the interviews of witnesses:

On 11/17/2024 Ofc. Bollwahn 23057 responded to assist EMS at W Louisiana Ave and S Tejon St, which is located in the City and County of Denver on an unresponsive party. Upon arriving on scene Ofc. Bollwahn located a black Acura MDX with Colorado license plate [REDACTED] parked on W Louisiana Ave facing westbound. He approached the vehicle and observed the victim, later identified as [REDACTED] lying face down in the backseat of the vehicle, and she was the only occupant. As he opened the door, he observed a used, burnt foil in the victims hand, along with a straw "tooter" in her mouth. Based on Your Affiant's training and experience Your Affiant knows that these items are an indicator of the consumption of fentanyl. Denver Paramedics arrived on scene and the victim was pronounced deceased by Dr. Nacht at 0033 hours.

Your Affiant spoke with Ofc. Bollwahn on 11/17/2024 and advised him to complete a Known Dead-Overdose report and route it to the Fentanyl Investigation Team.

On 11/18/2024 Your Affiant was assigned this case for follow up. Your Affiant reviewed all reports and evidence in this case. Your Affiant reviewed a statement from Officer Claymon 22094 who had conducted a neighborhood survey. During that survey he contacted [REDACTED] [REDACTED] had surveillance that showed the intersection of W Louisiana Ave and S Tejon St. Ofc. Claymon stated that he reviewed the surveillance video and observed the victim's vehicle arrive and park at 1620 hours. The victim then exited the driver's seat and entered the rear of the vehicle. He then

stated that he watched the camera footage sped up for the next hour and did not see anyone else enter or exit the vehicle.

Your Affiant looked at the evidence recovered in this case and observed that a phone had not been recovered. Your Affiant saw that the victim's vehicle had been towed to the Denver Police Impound with a hold for the Fentanyl Team.

Your Affiant responded to the Denver Police Impound at 5160 York St and conducted a search of the vehicle which was registered to the victim. In the vehicle Your Affiant located a black iPhone with a black case and a multicolored Apple sticker on the back. Your Affiant collected the phone and booked it into evidence under invoice number 1449915-1. Your Affiant then checked the phone out of evidence and conducted an extraction of the phone utilizing GreyKey. Due to the phone losing power and turning off Your Affiant was only able to get a Before First Unlock extraction, which contained limited data but showed the victims phone was named [REDACTED] and that the phone number was [REDACTED]. Your Affiant reviewed the extraction and did not locate any information that was relevant to this investigation.

On 11/19/2024 Your Affiant was contacted by Ofc. Gassman, who was working the front desk of Denver Police Department District 3. He stated that the victim's roommate [REDACTED] was at District 3 and had brought the victim's laptop to turn in as evidence, hoping that there was helpful information. Your Affiant asked Ofc. Gassman to ask [REDACTED] if she knew the passcode for the victim's phone. [REDACTED] provided the passcode [REDACTED]. Your Affiant attempted the passcode, and it unlocked the phone. Your Affiant responded to District 3 and spoke with [REDACTED]. They again provided the passcode, confirmed the victims phone number as [REDACTED] and confirmed that the service was through AT&T. Your Affiant unlocked the phone and located a series of text messages between the victim and an unknown party using phone number [REDACTED] that started on 11/03/2024. Your Affiant reviewed the messages and found a series of texts that started on 11/16/2024 at 1559 hours.

This is a transcript of these messages:

Based on Your Affiant's training and experience Your Affiant believed this to be a conversation related to the purchase of \$40.00 of illicit narcotics.

Your Affiant returned to Denver Police Headquarters and completed a full file system extraction of the victim's cell phone utilizing Cellebrite Premium Service, due to the acquired passcode.

Your Affiant then contacted the HALO unit of the Denver Police Department, and reviewed camera footage from a camera located at W Mississippi Ave and S Raritan St. Your Affiant observed the victim's vehicle pull into the parking lot on the northeast corner of W Mississippi Ave and S Raritan St at 1610 hours. The victim is observed going into the liquor store at that location, alone. The victim then exits the store alone at 1612 hours, she then drives east through the lot and pulls south across W Mississippi Ave. She then pulls into the parking lot of 1798 W Mississippi Ave at 1613 hours and is out of view of the camera. At 1618 hours the victim's vehicle pulled north on S Raritan St at W Mississippi Ave and drove north across Mississippi Ave and pulled into the parking lot on the north side. The vehicle pulled into the lot and turned westbound. The vehicle came to a stop and a passenger exited the vehicle, and then went into one of the stores. The vehicle then pulled westbound through the parking lot and then turned westbound on Mississippi Ave. At 1620:10 hours the victim vehicle drove westbound through the intersection of W Mississippi Ave and S Raritan St. Your Affiant then reviewed the surveillance video from 1301 S Tejon St and it showed the victims vehicle arrive and park at W Louisiana Ave and S Tejon St at 1620:34 hours. It should be noted that this location is approximately 3 blocks from the parking lot that the victim left from.

On 11/20/2024 at 1325 hours Your Affiant conducted an undercover buy/bust operation. Your Affiant provided the phone number ██████████ to Det. Vina Maciel. Det. Maciel contacted the number and was able to arrange a meeting with the unknown party to purchase \$80.00 in fentanyl pills. Det. Maciel while under both audio and visual surveillance pulled into the northeast parking lot of W Mississippi Ave and S Federal Blvd. Det. Maciel continued communication with the number. At approximately 1335 a Hispanic male wearing a black hoody with white writing approached the undercover vehicle and entered the passenger side. Det. Maciel provided the suspect with \$80.00 in prerecorded US Currency and he provided her with 29 suspected fentanyl pills. The suspect, identified as Jaime Chavez Calix 10/12/93, exited the vehicle and walked west through the parking lot where he was arrested without incident. His cellphone, a Motorola cellphone was collected on scene from his person and booked into evidence.

Your Affiant conducted an interview with Jaime Chavez Calix. He was read his Miranda Advisement in Spanish by Det. John Robledo, waived his rights, and agreed to talk with investigators. During the conversation he stated that his phone number is ██████████ and that he had been using that phone for about three weeks. He further stated that he had been selling pills for around three weeks for extra money because he couldn't find work.

On 11/25/2024 Your Affiant completed search warrants for the phone recovered from Jaime Chavez Calix, the AT&T Call Detail Records for the victim's phone line ██████████, and the T-Mobile Call Detail Records for the phone line that was being used by Jaime Chavez Calix ██████████

The warrants were reviewed and approved by the Honorable Judge Renee Goble. Your Affiant then served the warrants on AT&T and T-Mobile via their email warrant service.

Your Affiant attempted to complete a forensic cellular device extraction on the Motorola Moto G cell phone that was recovered from Jaime Chavez Calix. Your Affiant was able to complete a partial extraction of the information in the phone. Your Affiant was able to confirm that the phone number [REDACTED] did belong to the recovered device. No other information of evidentiary value was recovered from the phone.

On 11/27/2024 Your Affiant responded to Salon Ocampo located at 1733 W Mississippi Ave and met with [REDACTED] allowed Your Affiant to review security footage from his business of the parking lot area for 11/16/2024. Your Affiant reviewed the video and located footage of the victim's vehicle pulling into the lot from W Mississippi Ave at around 1618 hours and it stops. An unknown male exited the back passenger side of the car and walked out of frame. The victim then drove west through the lot and pulled back onto W Mississippi Ave. This video confirmed the video recovered from HALO and showed that the suspect exited the back seat of the victims vehicle. It should be noted that when Your Affiant responded to the Denver Vehicle Impound to recover the victim's cell phone, a large cooler was observed in the front passenger seat of the vehicle making it difficult for someone to sit in that seat.

On 12/02/2024 Your Affiant received the results of the Search Warrant that was served to AT&T for the victims call detail records. These results also contained available location data. Your Affiant reviewed the information provided. These results showed that the only person that the victim contacted between 1559 hours and 1613 hours was the suspect phone number. The location data also placed the victims phone in the area of W Mississippi Ave and S Raritan St at around 1609 hours, which is consistent with the observed camera footage. The victims phone then stays in that area and the area around W Louisiana Ave and S Tejon St and doesn't leave until the vehicle is impounded by Officers on scene. The phones location can then be followed to the Denver Vehicle Impound. The last text that the victim sent was to the suspect phone number at 1613:17. She received calls from her roommate [REDACTED] however she did not send any texts or make any calls after the text at 1613:17.

On 12/12/2024 Your Affiant received an email from T-Mobile. In the email T-Mobile indicated that they did not have any records for the requested phone number. Your Affiant reviewed the warrant and found an error with the phone number. Your Affiant corrected the warrant, had it approved by DA Thain Bell. Your Affiant then had the warrant read and approved by the Honorable Judge Olympia Fay. Your Affiant then served the warrant on T-Mobile via email.

On 12/30/2024 Your Affiant received the return for the suspects phone number from T-Mobile.

On 01/07/2025 Your Affiant received the Autopsy Report for [REDACTED] which was completed by Dr. Meredith Frank. Dr. Frank stated in the report "Based on the examination findings and history available to me at this time, it is my opinion that [REDACTED] a 30-year-old female, died as the result of the toxic effects of fentanyl. The manner of death is accident." Your Affiant further reviewed the report, specifically the toxicology report and found that the victim had 4

substances in her blood at the time of her death. Cotinine, which is a metabolite of Nicotine, Fentanyl at 5.2ng/mL, Norfentanyl, a metabolite of fentanyl, and 4-ANPP which is a precursor to fentanyl.

On 01/09/2025 Your Affiant reviewed the return from the T-Mobile search warrant for the suspects phone. Your Affiant found that there was no cell tower location data provided for text messages, however location data was provided for calls. Your Affiant found that at 1540 hours on 11/16/2024 The suspect Jaime Chavez Calix received a phone call. The phone pinged off of a cell tower at S Raritan St just south of W Mississippi Ave. The suspect did not receive another call until 1645 hours on 11/16/2024, however the call pinged from the same cell tower on S Raritan St just south of W Mississippi Ave. Based on this information Your Affiant knows that the phone that the suspect was using on 11/16/2024 during the time he met with the victim [REDACTED], was in the location of W Mississippi Ave and S Raritan St. This information is consistent with the victims location, as well as the area that the suspect told the victim to respond to in the text message.

Based on the Information received in this case Your Affiant found that Jaime Alexander Chavez Calix 10/12/1993, White Male, 5'6", 150lbs, Black Hair, Brown Eyes, SID 4390961, FBI# 937380AE2 distributed fentanyl to [REDACTED] which led to her death in violation of 18-18-405(1), (2)(c)(V),(2)(a)(III) Distribution of Fentanyl Resulting in Death, a Class 1 Drug Felony.

Your affiant respectfully requests that an arrest warrant be issued for **Jaime Alexander Chavez Calix 10/12/1993, White Male, 5'6", 150lbs, Black Hair, Brown Eyes, SID 4390961, FBI# 937380AE2 for 18-18-405(1), (2)(c)(V),(2)(a)(III) Distribution of Fentanyl Resulting in Death a Class 1 Drug Felony**


