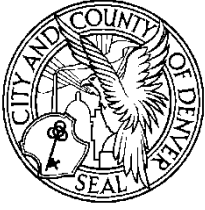

**AFFIDAVIT AND APPLICATION FOR ARREST WARRANT
AND THE ARREST WARRANT FOR THE PERSON(S) OF:**

Jesus JURADO-LUGO, dob: 03-21-1999, a Hispanic male, 5'9", 150 pounds with black hair and brown eyes, [REDACTED], [REDACTED], for one count of Murder in the First Degree, C.R.S. 18-3-102 (1) (a), a Class 1 Felony and one count of Assault in the First Degree, C.R.S. 18-3-202, (1) (a), a Class 3 Felony.

I, Detective Randal Denison, 96007, Your Affiant states under oath that the facts known to the Affiant which establish probable cause to believe that a criminal offense was committed, and that the offense was committed by the above named person(s), are the following:

On Sunday, July 16, 2017 Your Affiant and Detective Troy Bisgard were assigned to investigate the shooting death of Lydia Coronado, dob: 03-1-1991 and the serious injury by gun shot of [REDACTED] that occurred on that date at approximately 7:40 pm in the area of W. Kentucky Avenue and S. Alcott Street in the City and County of Denver.

On Sunday, July 16, 2017 at 8:02 pm Your Affiant was called by Homicide Unit Supervisor, Sergeant James Kukuris. Sergeant Kukuris told Your Affiant that there had been a reported shooting on the 1000 block of S. Alcott Street and that a female had been pronounced deceased at the scene and that a male victim had been transported to Denver Health Medical Center where he was reported to be in critical condition.

Your Affiant responded to that location, arriving at 8:30 pm. Your Affiant met with Major Crimes Unit, Night Shift Supervisor, Sergeant Craig Scott and Detective Johnathan Joyce.

Your Affiant learned that the victims had been found in a vehicle that was stopped on the street in front of 1044 S. Alcott Street. Denver Fire and Paramedics had responded to the scene. The female, later identified as Lydia Jolene Coronado, dob: 03-1-991 had been pronounced deceased at the scene at 7:51 pm by Doctor Shockley of Denver Health Medical Center, (DHMC). Your Affiant learned that the male victim, later identified as [REDACTED] had been transported to Denver Health Medical Center where he was listed in critical condition. Your Affiant observed this vehicle to be an older model, gold Toyota four, (4) door, bearing Colorado temporary tag 082818V, and that that it had been covered with a tent by Officers for protection and privacy.

Your Affiant learned that initial investigation indicated that the shooting of the two victims had occurred at Houston Lake Park, W. Kentucky Avenue and S. Alcott Street, approximately one and half blocks

north of the vehicle location and that the suspect(s) were believed to be associated with a late model, white Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck that was at that location.

Your Affiant learned that several witnesses had been located and were transported to Denver Police Department Headquarters to be interviewed. Detective Troy Bisgard arrived at the scene. Your Affiant told Detective Bisgard what he had learned and observed.

Your Affiant went to Denver Police Department Headquarters to conduct interviews and investigation.

Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with a witness, [REDACTED] Denver Police Officer Ulloa was present and acted as an interpreter. [REDACTED] told Your Affiant she had been driving to the grocery store with her son, [REDACTED] age 12 and daughter, [REDACTED], age 10. As they drove past the park on W. Kentucky, she saw a male holding two pistols and pointing them towards a gold colored sedan. She described this male as approximately 18-20 years of age, 5', with light complexion, a tattoo on the left side of his neck and wearing a white short sleeved shirt. After they passed by she heard gun shots. Her son said there was shooting. She told him to call 911. They drove around several blocks and past the park again. As they drove past her daughter recorded video using her cellular telephone. When they watched the video later, they saw the man they had seen with the gun in the video and returned to area and contacted Police.

Your Affiant viewed the video with [REDACTED] that her daughter, [REDACTED] had recorded as they drove past the park. [REDACTED] pointed out the male she had seen with a gun. [REDACTED] allowed Detectives to obtain the video from the cellular telephone. Your Affiant captured still photographs of the man [REDACTED] identified as the man she had seen with a gun.

Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with [REDACTED], age 12. [REDACTED] told Your Affiant that he was going to the store with his mother and sister. They drove past the park and saw a man pointing two pistols at brownish colored car. After they passed by, he heard several gun shots. They drove around and past the park again. He saw the same man he had seen holding the pistols when they drove past the first time. His sister recorded video and the man was on the recording. [REDACTED] indicated on a still photograph the male wearing a white t-shirt, standing next to another male lying on the ground, as the male he had seen with a gun when they drove past the park the first time.

Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with [REDACTED], age 10. [REDACTED] told Your Affiant that she was going to the store with her mother and brother. They drove past the park and saw a man with a gun. After they passed by, she heard several gun shots. They drove around and past the park again. As they drove past the park again she recorded video with a cellular telephone and the man she had seen with a gun earlier was in the video. [REDACTED] indicated on a still photograph, the male wearing a white t-shirt, standing next to another male lying on the ground, as the male she had seen with a gun when they drove past the park the first time.

Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with [REDACTED] said the, "The guy that did it is Jurado". [REDACTED] told Your Affiant that he owns the white 2014 Chevrolet Silverado pickup truck at the park. [REDACTED] said he uses the moniker, [REDACTED] and has it tattooed on his arm. [REDACTED] said that on Saturday night he had gone out to a nightclub with his friend, [REDACTED] and that they travelled there in his pickup truck. After leaving the club they went to a motel

on W. Colfax Avenue with the word, "Denver" in the name, where there was a small party in a room. There were several females at the room who he did not know. While at the motel, [REDACTED] introduced him to a Hispanic male, "Jurado". They stayed at motel and, "partied" through the night. Sometime the following day he and Jurado left the motel. He asked Jurado to drive his truck because he had been drinking. They picked up three females that Jurado knew and went to Huston Lake Park, arriving around 3:00-4:00 pm. Later he had been sitting on grass with the three females and observed Jurado in the driver's seat of his pickup truck. There was a male who did not know in the front passenger seat, and a female he did not know in the rear passenger side seat. There was some type of argument between Jurado and the male and female and they got out of the truck. The female grabbed the keys to his truck and ran to a gold colored vehicle then got in the driver's seat. The male ran to the passenger side of that vehicle and got in. As the female pulled out of the parking spot and started to drive away, Jurado took out a pistol and fired one or two times into the vehicle. The vehicle drove off down the street. When Police started to arrive, Jurado left travelling west on foot through the park and he had not seen him since that time. [REDACTED] viewed still photographs of the suspect captured from the video recorded by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] identified the male wearing and white t-shirt and standing next to a male lying on the ground as the man known to him as, "Jurado" and who he observed shoot into the vehicle. Mr. Hernandez identified a photograph of [REDACTED].

On July 18, 2017 at 8:20 Your Affiant and Detective Adam Golden conducted an audio recorded interview of [REDACTED] in the Surgical Intensive Care Unit at Denver Health Medical Center where his is a patient. [REDACTED] told the Detectives that he had gone to Houston Lake park with his sister in-law, [REDACTED]. When they arrived at the park, they parked next to a white Chevrolet pickup truck. There was a Hispanic male who he did not know, seated in the front passenger seat of the pickup with the window down. The male started talking to them and appeared interested in [REDACTED]. They got out of their vehicles and were talking. The male asked [REDACTED] was his girlfriend. He told the male she was his sister-in-law. The male asked [REDACTED] to get in the truck to have a beer. They agreed. He got in front passenger seat since they did not know the male and did not want [REDACTED] sitting next to him. [REDACTED] got in the passenger side of the rear seat. They were talking for short time when the male noticed [REDACTED]'s gold neck chain and commented about it being nice. The male then took out a pistol and pointed it at [REDACTED] and told him to give him the necklace. [REDACTED] refused and the male reached over and grabbed for the necklace, ripping his shirt in the process. [REDACTED] reached and tried to push the gun away. [REDACTED] to get out of the truck and leave. They both got out and got in [REDACTED] said he heard gun shots and realized he had been shot in the left hips area. [REDACTED] said he did not remember if he was inside, or outside the car when he was shot. He said he remembered [REDACTED] was driving the car the then started, "snoring" and not driving. He pulled the parking brake and turned the car to the side of the street. [REDACTED] viewed still photographs of the suspect captured from the video recorded by [REDACTED] identified the male wearing a white t-shirt and standing next to a male lying on the ground as the man who pulled the gun on him and tried to take his necklace and then shot at them.

On Tuesday, July 18, 2017 Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] told Your Affiant the on Saturday he had rented a room in the Denver Inn at Wadsworth Boulevard and W. Colfax Avenue. He called his friend, [REDACTED] and asked him if he wanted to go to a club. [REDACTED] came to the motel and they went to a nightclub, Church in [REDACTED] white Chevrolet pickup truck. They stayed until close to closing time and then went back to the motel. Several other friends, including Jesus Jurado came to the motel. Several females who he did not know

came to the motel. He drank a lot and became intoxicated. Early in the morning Durango gave him a ride home and he had not seen him since that time. [REDACTED] identified a booking photograph of Jesus Jurado-Lugo, dob: 03-21-1999 as his friend, Jesus Jurado who had been at the motel. [REDACTED] viewed still photographs of the suspect captured from the video recorded by [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] identified the male wearing a white t-shirt and standing next to a male lying on the ground as his friend Jesus Jurado and the same man he had identified in the booking photograph.

On Tuesday, July 18, 2017 Your Affiant received an email from Denver Police Detective Jacob Huffine with an attached photograph of five, (5) males that had been supplied to him by [REDACTED] and was said to include the suspect.

On Wednesday, July 19, 2017 Your Affiant spoke with [REDACTED] by telephone. She said that the photograph had been supplied to her by another witness to the shooting, [REDACTED] and that she was with [REDACTED] at that time. Your Affiant spoke with [REDACTED] by telephone. [REDACTED] confirmed she had obtained the photograph of the five, (5) males from social media and identified the male to far left, wearing tan pants as the man she had seen shooting in the park.

On Wednesday, July 19, 2017 at 2:33 pm Your Affiant personally conducted a recorded interview with [REDACTED] Denver Police Department Headquarters. [REDACTED] told Your Affiant that he known Jesus Jurado for 3 or 4 years and that they had attended high school together and that he works with Jurado's father. He described them as being good friends. [REDACTED] said that on Sunday he had been at the home of friend who lives next door to Jurado's parents. He said that Jurado had come to his parent's home several times during that day. He said Jurado was driving a nice, white, newer model, four, (4) door Silverado pickup truck and was with a Hispanic male he did not know. [REDACTED] said he had last seen Jurado with truck at his parent's house around 3:00-4:00 pm and at that time there was also two younger Hispanic females in the truck that he did not known. [REDACTED] said that around 7:00-8:00 pm Jurado's [REDACTED] arrived at the house driving an older, brown four, (4) door Hyundai, and Jurado in the car with him. They were followed by two other Hispanic males in a small red car. He said Jurado was screaming and crying and hitting his head on the car. Jurado was saying, "Why me", "Why did I do this to myself", asking God to help him and saying he wanted to kill himself. [REDACTED] said Jurado had a black pistol and was putting it to his head. He said they took the pistol away from Jurado and the male driving the small red car took the pistol and left. Jurado's parents tried to calm him down. They got him back in the car and left with him. [REDACTED] said that was the last time he saw Jurado. [REDACTED] said that [REDACTED] told him that his brother had called and asked him to pick him up at Huston Lake Park because he was being robbed. [REDACTED] said when he got to the park and saw Police in the area he knew his brother had done something. [REDACTED] s that [REDACTED] later told him that Jurado was with his grandmother in Chihuahua, Mexico and provided a contact phone number of [REDACTED] said he had tried to call JURADO at that phone number, but a female who spoke only Spanish and he could not communicate with her. [REDACTED] identified a DPD booking photograph of Jesus Jarado-Lugo, dob: 03-21-1999, minus any identifying as information as his friend and man he was talking about. [REDACTED] viewed a photograph of five, (5) males that had been received from [REDACTED] identified the male to the far left hand side of the photograph, wearing tan pants, white tennis shoes and no shirt as Jesus Jurado. [REDACTED] viewed a still photograph of the suspect captured from a video recorded by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] said the male pictured standing in photograph wearing blue jeans and a white t-shirt appeared to be Jurado.

On Friday, July 21, 2017 at 1:40 pm Your Affiant met with [REDACTED] [REDACTED] supplied Your Affiant with a copy of a registration from July 15, 2017 that lists [REDACTED] as checking in at 9:40 pm on that date to room 121, A copy of Colorado State ID card, [REDACTED] assigned to [REDACTED] was attached to the registration.

Detective Bisgard told Your Affiant that when he viewed Lydia Coronado's body, he observed an apparent through and through type gunshot wound to her torso.

Your Affiant reviewed a Serious Bodily Injury Form completed by Doctor Shockley at Denver Health Medical Center on [REDACTED]. The form indicates [REDACTED] suffered a substantial risk of death and a substantial risk of, or protracted loss or impairment of a part or organ of his body.

Based on the foregoing information, Your Affiant requests that a warrant be issued for **Jesus JURADO-LUGO, dob: 03-21-1999**, a Hispanic male, 5'9", 150 pounds with black hair and brown eyes, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] for one count of Murder in the First Degree, C.R.S. 18-3-102 (1) (a), a Class 1 Felony and one count of Assault in the First Degree, C.R.S. 18-3-202, (1) (a), a Class 3 Felony.

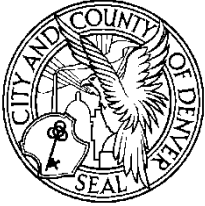
